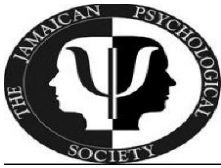

## **The Jamaica Psychological Society Graduate Research Grant**

All psychology graduate students who are members of the Jamaican Psychological Society (JPS) are eligible to apply for a **JPS Graduate Research Grant**. A grant of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) will be presented to two candidates, to fund their proposed research project. These grants honour the JPS's commitment to the development of psychology students and the promotion of the highest standards in psychological research.

### Eligibility

The proposer:

- Must be a graduate student at a recognized tertiary institution, offering a psychology programme with practical research training:
  - The Institute of Theological and Leadership Development
  - Northern Caribbean University
  - The University of the West Indies
  - University College of the Caribbean
- Must be a JPS student member at the time of submission of research proposal
- Must submit a proposal for research being conducted to meet degree requirements

### **Procedure.**

Proposal entries must be received at the JPS office, 14 Ruthven Road, Kingston 4, by October 1, 2005. A three-person committee, appointed by JPS president, Dr. Kai Morgan and vice-president Dr. Garth Lipps, will review each proposal.

The recipient will be announced by December 1, 2005. Recipient's research supervisor and the affiliated institution will also be informed. Each grant will comprise of one cheque amounting to the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) and payable to the student researcher.

By accepting the grant, recipients agree to provide to the Jamaican Psychological Society, by October 1, 2006, a copy of the completed research paper and a research article suitable for publication. The recipient agrees to acknowledge the Jamaican Psychological Society's financial support in any report, presentation or publication stemming from the research.

### **Submission Requirements**

The proposer must provide:

- Completed JPS Research Information Form
- A summary of the proposed research (up to four pages)

This should include:

- Research Title
- Principal Investigators
- Research Background Information
- Rationale
- A Comprehensive Methodology
- Ethical Considerations – Benefits & Risks to Participants and Copy of Informed Consent(s) (if applicable)
- An itemized budget showing anticipated expenses
